Julie is non-verbal, but anyone who meets her will learn quickly not to underestimate her! She is eight years old, very academic and understands all levels of communication, but she finds it difficult to communicate in return.

She started attending CRC services at just two years old. She needs specific supports that only exist in the CRC. So needless to say, they have been an absolutely wonderful support for Julie and our family.

The CRC Speech and Language Therapy Clinic helped her find ways to communicate. Over the years she has been able to try different devices for communicating and now has an eyegaze computer, which allows her to communicate with her eyes. It has become her voice.

This is why we are so grateful to lovely people like you who support the CRC. You have given our daughter a voice. We didn't know if that would be possible.

And that's not all. Julie has been able to access physiotherapy and occupational therapy, helping her hand function develop. In turn, this means she can now control her very own powered wheelchair that the CRC provided for her. This has given her much more independence.

Because of your amazing support for CRC, Julie can now communicate with friends and family, participate in school, and become physically independent. These are extraordinary leaps. She has been able to overcome so much thanks to the CRC and people like you.

Who we are.

Established in 1951, the CRC is a voluntary organisation and national charity working with children and adults living with disabilities.

Lady Valerie Goulding and Kathleen O'Rourke founded the CRC to provide treatment for people affected by an outbreak of polio. As demand for our services changed and increased, so too did our need for space and for different kinds of facilities. We expanded to a number of different locations where no other services were available. We opened a small primary school and a sheltered workshop. Over the decades, the CRC has grown into one of the largest and most progressive providers of supports and services to children and adults with disabilities in Ireland.

The CRC offers expert care, education, training, therapy, and support to children and adults with disabilities, including cerebral palsy, neuromuscular disorders, spinal bifida, rare genetic conditions, autistic spectrum disorders, and much more.

CRC POOL & HYDROPOOL

The pool provides accessible physical activity and participation to people with physical disabilities. Aquatherapy in our Hydropool is an essential low-impact physiotherapy tool. Your help can keep the pool heated and maintained, build an easy-to-navigate changing room, and provide vital equipment like dimmable coloured lights to help children on the autistic spectrum feel comfortable and engaged.



SUMMER CAMP

Summer camp is a much-loved experience for children of all ages. Your help will provide staff, activities, and developmental programmes for everyone to enjoy.



SUMMER RESEARCH STUDENTS

For just €4,500, you can make it possible for medical or therapy students to come in for 6 weeks to do cuttingedge research in an area of need, helping to drive progress and learning. In 2023 CRC facilitated three research students with their research.

POST-DOCTORAL RESEARCH

With funding for research, we can make strides in planning for new pathways and schemes to assist in the earlier identification of babies and infants at high risk of cerebral palsy, so that they receive gold-standard intervention. This will greatly help to diagnose their needs and deliver better service to newborns and families. Post-Doctoral Research can cost between \leq 45,000 and \leq 50,000.

FINISH THE IMMERSIVE ROOM

Our immersive room is a very special, interactive space, where people who use our services and their loved ones can spend time in during their visit to the CRC. The fully immersive virtual reality enables fun and relaxation in a safe and protected environment. The space has been invaluable in development for all age groups. From toddlers learning in the room how to use their first powerchair, to children with all types of learning needs discovering about the solar system, to adults developing the skills so they can independently travel - this inclusive room has become a space where we can dream and grow. Its progress has been halted due to a lack of funds. The funding required to complete the room currently stands at €25,000.





CHILDREN'S CHRISTMAS PARTIES

Sophia's story

Before my daughter Sophia was born, we were told she "Wouldn't be what we'd expect." It was a tough start with a lot of complications and months in hospital. She is a full-time wheelchair user and has been in the CRC since she was 8 months.

But from that tough start, over the years, our daughter has been able to thrive. She's been on the Late Late Show, and now at 16 years is campaigning for equal rights for people with disabilities. She was also invited to host the Ombudsman for Children Child Talks, which gives children a platform to talk about issues that are important to them. Suffice to say I'm a proud dad!

How we got from here to there – well, that's where the CRC comes in.

When we first got into CRC, I remember people saying, "How lucky are you!" And day after day, year on year – that has been the truth.

With CRC, Sophia gets every unique support she needs. From physio to the chair, occupational therapy, all the care you can imagine. They've made a huge difference to her life, well-being and confidence. They've been with her and us the whole journey.

The CRC is a centre of excellence. You go in, and you see people of all ages looking content, smiling, having that security and safety around them. It's remarkable.

The generosity of CRC supporters has meant a beautiful and fulfilled life for my daughter. In turn it means better and stronger communities where people with disabilities are empowered and equipped to engage and take part.
